The Baltimore City Department of Transportation (BCDOT) and The Waterfront Partnership of Baltimore announce the end of the Point East Shuttle effective August 9, 2019. The three-year contract between BCDOT and Transdev, the shuttle operator, expires on that same date.

The Point East Shuttle was established as a temporary solution to help alleviate commuter traffic in Harbor East and Harbor Point during the construction of the Central Avenue Bridge. With access to the bridge now open to the public, BCDOT has no further plans to renew or continue to fund the Point East Shuttle past August 9, 2019.

Baltimore City Department of Transportation provides resources for alternative options for commuters driving into the city, including, **iRide Baltimore**, a free commuter matchmaking service for carpooling, vanpooling, or biking. The program's *Guaranteed Ride Home* program ensures you'll never be stranded when you need to get to where you need to be.
